
Safe Patient Handling: Facility Committees

Under the New York State Safe Patient Handling (SPH) Law, each healthcare facility, including every hospital and clinic, must establish a committee. A strong committee will play a key part in establishing and maintaining an effective SPH Program at your workplace.

The SPH Committee

CCORDING TO THE LAW; "The purpose of a committee is to design and recommend the process for implementing a safe patient handling program for the health care facility." The committee will also be involved in ongoing evaluation and improvement of the program. A SPH Program must include the following elements, and the committee must be consulted on each:

Y Patient Assessment Process

Training and Education

✓ Incident Investigation and Review

Annual Performance Evaluation

☑ Plans for Construction/Remodeling

Workers' Right to Refuse

Committee Membership and Leadership

HE COMMITTEE MUST, by law, include people with different responsibilities related to safe patient handling, such as risk management, nursing, or purchasing. The committee must have two co-chairs, one from management and one frontline worker. Check with your facility to identify who the committee members are. Half of the committee members must be frontline, non-managerial workers who provide direct care to patients. Unions have the right to designate their representatives.
